Our Program

We provide day and overnight field trips for elementary and high school students, focusing on outdoor exploration, teambuilding, and leadership development. All activities are led by our trained Cave Springs staff, who tailor the program to fit each grade level, group interests, and curriculum needs.



About Us



Located in Lincoln, Ontario, Cave
Springs is beautifully nestled on the
Niagara Escarpment with direct access
to the Bruce Trail. Since 1951, we've
been offering summer camps and, since
the mid-1990s, school field trips. Our site
includes a variety of outdoor activities
such as forest exploration and hiking
trails, natural springs, campfire areas,
high and low ropes courses, archery, a
swimming pool, an outdoor pavilion, six
heated and air-conditioned cabins, a
Dining Hall, and a year-round
Conference Centre.

AMAZING RACE

In small groups, teams work together to accomplish a series of challenges. Teams travel to different areas of the site as they find special items, look for answers and unleash creativity. After completing a challenge, teams present their accomplishment to a Field Marshall. Points are awarded for both speed and quality. Success comes from productive collaboration and problem solving.



ARCHERY

At our archery range, students learn how to safely use our bows and arrows. Students take turns using the archery equipment as they follow the structure, rules and processes provided by the staff archery leader.





CAMPFIRE BUILDING

At one of our designated campfire pits, Cave Springs staff guide students on how to build a campfire. Students help collect kindling, tinder, and logs and learn about different ways to build campfires. Students roast their own marshmallows for s'mores or cook hotdogs. Dietary requirements can be accommodated.



CAMP GAMES & CRAFTS

We offer a wide range of active and cooperative games, encouraging students to stay engaged and work together. In our Craft Hall, students can unleash their creativity through a variety of craft activities, using different materials and mediums. All necessary materials and equipment are provided by Cave Springs Camp.



FOREST STUDY

In the Boreal Forest, students explore the plant life and creatures that inhabit the forest and our nearby natural springs. They begin by sharing their ideas about what they might find in the forest. Then, they embark on a search to discover interesting plants and animals. Afterward, students gather to share and discuss their findings in a show-and-tell format.



HIKING

The Cave Springs site has beautiful hiking trails with natural scenery and intriguing destinations. Popular destinations include the Ice Caves, German Spy Hole and portions of the Bruce Trail. On hikes, students can explore ice caves and enjoy observing the forest ecosystem. All hikes are led by experienced guides who share stories and history associated with different destination points. We are connected to the Bruce Trail and the Niagara Peninsula Conversation Area of Cave Springs.



TEAM-BUILDING & LEADERSHIP

We provide a diverse range of team-building activities designed to enhance communication, collaboration, and leadership. Each game presents a challenge with specific goals and unique rules. Teams determine how to achieve the goal through communication and various strategies.



LARGE GROUP GAMES

In open fields and throughout the property we organize large group games that involve running, chasing and searching. Popular games include Capture the Flag, Camouflage, Survival, and Smuggler and Spies.



SHELTER BUILDING

Small groups collaborate to build a shelter using available materials in an open forested area. Students are encouraged to get creative and focus on achieving one or more of the following goals:

- Sufficient size to accommodate the entire team
- Durability to withstand various weather conditions
- Comfort for living



ORIENTEERING

Cave Springs staff introduce students to the basics of orienteering and map reading. Topics include identifying trail markers, using compasses, and navigating unfamiliar terrain. Students are then divided into small groups, working collaboratively to locate hidden items around the grounds using maps, compasses, and clues.



LOW ROPES

Groups walk through the forest surrounding Cave Springs and participate in a variety of low ropes course challenges. These challenges facilitate teamwork and collaboration to achieve success. Our site currently features a Whale Watch, with more exciting elements coming spring 2025.




HIGH ROPES

Cave Springs has a high ropes course that can be included with field trips. We follow all Ontario Camp Association (OCA) standards in ropes course operations. Students take turns climbing and we can host up to 20 students in a two hour period. All climbers must provide a completed health form.



SWIMMING

Students can relax and cool off in our 60'x30' pool, equipped with a deep end and diving board. They can enjoy free swim time or participate in games led by Cave Springs staff. Certified lifeguards are on duty to ensure safety while swimming. The pool comfortably accommodates up to 45 swimmers at once, but is certified for up to 75 swimmers at a time.



WATER GAMES

Water Games are a Cave Springs favourite for school groups during hot weather. Cool down with games such as Art Attack, Drip-Drip-Drop and Fire Brigade. All water games use safe items such as sponges.

SUPERVISION

Cave Springs programming is designed to be age appropriate and targeted to the goals of the individual group. This custom design helps achieve teacher specific goals and encourage cooperative participation and excitement. Cave Springs staff will do everything they can to sustain positive engagement, we ask that behavioural issues are the responsibility of the school. We are happy to discuss and support any strategies that are already in place to make your trip successful.



CELL PHONES

Whether or not you allow students to bring cell phones on their trip is up to you. We do have some activities for older students where cell phones may come in handy, such as the Amazing Race. We recommend that they are always kept in student bags so that phone engagement does not interfere with activity engagement. We want students to be engaged and connected with the program, with each other, the earth, and their peers. If students want to have pictures during their trip, we encourage teachers to be designated "photographers" so that students don't need to bring out their phones.



ACCESSIBILITY

A big characteristic of our site is that it is part of the natural world which may not always be accessible for all. We have wheelchair accessible washrooms and most of our buildings, including our cabins, are wheelchair accessible. Staff and students should be aware that most of the outdoor site where the majority of programming is conducted is grass, gravel paths, or trails. Students should also consider this to dress appropriately for the terrain and weather. If accessibility is a concern for your students or staff, please reach out to us for more details.



ACCOMMODATIONS

We have 6 cabins, each with 6 bunk beds and sleeps a total of 12. One bunk is separated from the rest because it was designed as a space for summer counsellors. In total, our cabins sleep 72 people. All cabins have electric heaters and air conditions to ensure comfort no matter what time of year you are visiting. When Overnight groups use the cabins, the teachers and chaperones are responsible for student supervision. Once the activities are done for the day, the Cave Springs staff are off duty. We have 4 bedrooms in our Conference Centre that are available for teachers and chaperones. Each bedroom has bunkbeds and a heating/cooling unit that is set with a thermostat in each room. These bedrooms are adjacent to bathrooms that are single use with solo showers.



WEATHER

Here at Cave Springs we operate our program rain or shine! Be sure to dress appropriately for the weather and be prepared for changing weather conditions. In the event of inclement weather, we have a variety of indoor spaces that can be used for alternative programming. We encourage you to bring rain coats and umbrellas if the forecast is calling for rain.




EMERGENCIES

Emergency procedures are posted in all buildings, and there will always be a Cave Springs staff on site. Trained staff will give instructions should an emergency occur. If a medical emergency occurs, 911 will be called and students who are not involved will be removed from the area. Our site is easily accessible by emergency services such as EMS and fire, and we are located close to West Lincoln Memorial Hospital. We also have an AED onsite.
